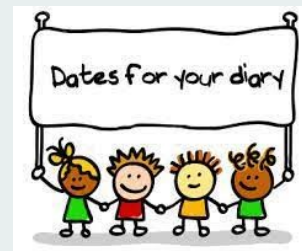

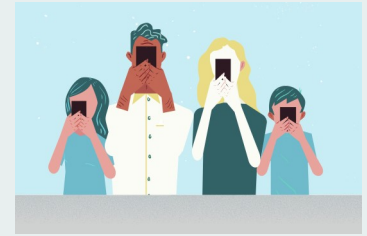


INTERNET SAFETY—SCREEN TIME
