



# Key Instant Recall Facts

## Summer Term One

### Chestnut Class

I know the multiplication facts for **all** the times tables

By the end of this half term, children should know the times table facts. The aim is for them to recall the facts **instantly**.

Below are some examples. Remember that you need to know all the facts for **all the times tables!!**

$1 \times 5 = 5$	$6 \times 10 = 60$
$2 \times 9 = 18$	$5 \times 9 = 45$
$8 \times 8 = 64$	$3 \times 8 = 24$
$3 \times 12 = 36$	$7 \times 12 = 84$
$5 \times 11 = 55$	$11 \times 11 = 121$

### Key Vocabulary

What is 6 multiplied by 8?

What is 11 times 3?

The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You do not need to practise them all at once; perhaps you could have a fact of the day.

What do you already know? – Use some of the facts that the children know from the easier tables to help with the harder ones.

Songs and Chants You can buy Times Tables CDs or find multiplication songs and chants online.

Buy one get three free If your child knows one fact (e.g.  $3 \times 5 = 15$ ), can they tell you the other three facts in the same fact family?
