Golden Ticket

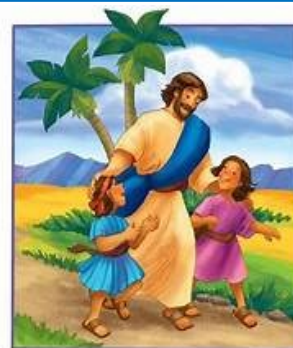
